



## **Psalms of Summer - Psalm 127- Psalm 127:1-5**

### Discussion Questions:

1. Read Psalm 127:1-2. What is the setting of this Psalm? Who is the author? What is the foundation you are building your life on? Is your foundation stable?
2. Read Psalm 127:3-5. If children are like arrows, then what unique characteristics do arrows have? How are children a blessing? What is the greatest adventure that God can send you on? How can they seem to be a burden? How must we remind ourselves in the tough moments that they are not a burden?
3. What target are you aiming at? What does a bullseye look like for your family? What things do we actually tend to serve? What firm foundation must we stand on to properly stand and aim our arrows? Is your foundation firm?
4. Why must we be willing to release our arrows? How is the role of raising a child a temporary assignment (Proverbs 22:6)? How are arrows different from swords? How are arrows different from shields? How can parents prevent children from being who they could be while trying to protect them?

### Reflection Questions:

1. How is raising up a generation of arrows who are on fire for Jesus the greatest hope we have for an upside down world? Parents, how will you do that? Others, how will we support both the parents and the children in this?
